## Economic Development

### About your EDC

The City of Sanger has established both a Type A and Type B economic development board to stimulate economic growth. These boards utilize sales tax revenues to stimulate the creation of new primary jobs in the community and to address quality of life issues. Sanger is pro-business and aggressively seeks new and expanded businesses that offer quality jobs for the community.

### Staff Updates

Staff has met with several prospects looking for available sites to establish a location, including distribution centers, grocery stores, a distillery, hotel, dental practice and a boutique.

The Sanger Texas Development Corporation (4B) has approved its first Property Enhancement Grant. Enhancements are now underway on the Woodmen of the World building (WOW) located in downtown. The new enhancements include a new awning, replacement of the upper story windows and painting the metal insets above the awnings.

Sales tax revenue collected in April for sales in February were \$48,180. Sales tax totals for FY 20-21 are \$360,026 as compared to \$302,474 for the same period last FY.





## Police & Animal Control

### April 2021 Monthly Report:

During the month of April 2021, Officers of the Sanger Police Department responded to a total of 859 calls for service having an average response time of five minutes per call. The department issued a total of 34 citations and 59 warnings.

## ***DID YOU KNOW...***

### **30.04. BURGLARY OF VEHICLES:**

With warmer weather comes an increase in criminal activity. Remember to remove all valuables from your vehicles and lock your doors.



**Sec. 30.04. BURGLARY OF VEHICLES.** (a) A person commits an offense if, without the effective consent of the owner, he breaks into or enters a vehicle or any part of a vehicle with intent to commit any felony or theft.

(b) For purposes of this section, "enter" means to intrude:

- (1) any part of the body; or
- (2) any physical object connected with the body.

(c) For purposes of this section, a container or trailer carried on a rail car is a part of the rail car.

(d) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor, except that:

- (1) the offense is a Class A misdemeanor with a minimum term of confinement of six months if it is shown on the trial of the offense that the defendant has been previously convicted of an offense under this section;
- (2) the offense is a state jail felony if:
  - (A) it is shown on the trial of the offense that the defendant has been previously convicted two or more times of an offense under this section; or
  - (B) the vehicle or part of the vehicle broken into or entered is a rail car; and
- (3) the offense is a felony of the third degree if:

- (A) the vehicle broken into or entered is owned or operated by a wholesale distributor of prescription drugs; and  
(B) the actor breaks into or enters that vehicle with the intent to commit theft of a controlled substance.  
(d-1) For the purposes of Subsection (d), a defendant has been previously convicted under this section if the defendant was adjudged guilty of the offense or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere in return for a grant of deferred adjudication, regardless of whether the sentence for the offense was ever imposed or whether the sentence was probated and the defendant was subsequently discharged from community supervision.  
(e) It is a defense to prosecution under this section that the actor entered a rail car or any part of a rail car and was at that time an employee or a representative of employees exercising a right under the Railway Labor Act (45 U.S.C. Section 151 et seq.).



#### Emergency Responses for April 2021:

The Sanger Fire Department responded to emergency incidents during the month of April. The top four busiest incident types:

- The busiest time of the day was at 15:00- 15:59 for the month of April
- Average total trip time for medical emergency incidents was 51:04.
- The busiest day of the week for EMS transports was Friday with 15 transports during the month.
- Emergency Medical calls accounted for 55.29 % of the total call volume.



### MOBILE APPS WITH LOCAL ALERT FUNCTIONS

**FEMA APP:** Stay updated with severe weather alerts from the National Weather Service for up to five locations across the U.S.; learn how to stay safe before, during, and after over 20 types of hazards; save a custom list of the items in your family’s emergency kit; and locate and receive driving directions to open shelters and disaster recovery centers. You can also submit disaster-related photos to a public map using the Disaster Reporter feature. The FEMA App is also available in Spanish. **AMERICAN RED CROSS APP:** The Red Cross Emergency app combines more than 35 different types of severe weather and emergency alerts. ### Municipal Court

#### Case Activity:

- For the month of April, 2021, the Municipal Court filed 59 citations.
- There were 14 requests for deferred disposition.
- There were two requests for driver safety course.
- There were 11 cases successfully closed by deferred disposition and two cases successfully closed by driver safety course.
- The court closed 49 cases by payment in full or time served.
- The total fines, court costs and other fees collected were \$14,981.90 with \$5,362.95 of that being remitted to the State.

#### Overview

The Utility Customer Service Office in City Hall is open early each weekday so customers can handle business before 8:00 am. Office hours are as follows:



## ***DID YOU KNOW...***

Pair salt and sand with alternating cold and warm weather and you've got the perfect conditions for potholes. The best way to handle potholes is to avoid them. But that's not always an option. If you see a pothole ahead and can't avoid it, the safest approach is to slow down and, right before you drive over the pothole, release your brakes. This reduces the speed of impact and gives your suspension a chance to minimize the effects.

### Water

#### During April the Water Department was able to:

- Have Mabak Directional Drilling installed a new sanitary sewer service and clean-out at 412 Bolivar Street.
- C & G Electric inspected the main breaker at South Bottom lift station. They have ordered parts to make repairs to the breaker handle.
- RLC Controls worked on the SCADA system at South Bottom lift station that was related to the breaker issue that C & G Electric was working on.
- Completed the Texas Water Development Board audit for the past five water years.
- Make repairs to one water main.
- Make repairs to seven water service lines.
- Make repairs to two sewer service lines.
- Install eight new water meters.
- Change out 15 water meters.
- Visually read 1,268 water meters that were not read by the mobile collector.
- Completed 254 water and sewer service orders.
- There were 3,103 active water connections and 3,123 active sewer connections during the month of April.

### ***DID YOU KNOW...***

Mulch is a great aid in retaining water in garden beds. In most cases, mulch can reduce evaporation and reduce water usage by over 25%.



## Parks and Recreation

### Operations:

200 acres were mowed in the month of April. In March we had 51 brush orders called in and 51 were completed (some picked up were not called in). The Parks Department also begin mowing and weeding on a regular cycle as well as putting out fertilizer and pre-emergent.

Some other projects completed by the Parks and Recreation Department Crew include:

- Disinfecting all city buildings and facilities every Friday.
- Final preparations for new basketball goals and additional spring toys have begun at Switzer Park.
- Continued assistance of Library clean-up after the water leak caused by the winter storm.
- Updating of the Fire Extinguisher for all city buildings has been completed.
- The moving process for one of our Outdoor Warning Sirens to Porter Park began and is progressing quickly. The moving of this siren will continue to provide adequate coverage to the downtown area while also providing coverage to the undercovered Porter Park.
- Continued maintenance of all city buildings that include eaves work due to roof leaks, garage door repairs, and other necessary items.
- The Splash Pad at Switzer Park was brought on for testing and maintenance is being completed to have it ready for Memorial Day.

### Facilities:

Our closed air facilities were closed due to COVID-19 restrictions for the month of April but pavilion rentals opened up. There was one pavilion rental for the month of April but several were booked for coming months. Elections were held at the Community Center for most of the month of April. Facilities include our Community Center and Historical Presbyterian Church as well as park pavilions. League play continues for both baseball and softball at our complexes.

### Recreation:

The Recreation Department was EGGcited this month because we got to hold not one but TWO events for the community! On Friday, April 2, 2021 we held our annual Teen Easter Egg that is for the teens of the community. We have a DJ come out and play fun dance music, we have fun lights to dance by, snacks, and of course the 3,300 glow-in-the-dark eggs! We had over 200 teens at this event and a great time was had by all who attended!

We turned around and hid 12,500 eggs for the youngest of the community. We staggered the ages for the hunt this year and it worked incredibly well at following Covid guidelines but also at ensuring that all age hunters were able to find and get some eggs and treats. An actual number of kids couldn't be determined but this event was our biggest Easter Egg to date with all the hunts full of adorable kids with their baskets and excited.





- Repairs to the building continued, including the replacement of carpet and patching and painting walls. Since the flooring company did not have the pneumatic lift equipment they used previously, moving the rows of shelves with books on them was more problematic. Many of the books that were removed by the company were not put back in the correct order, creating a chaotic situation on the shelves that library staff has spent considerable time fixing and will need to continue to address.



- Staff from the city's Parks and Streets department disassembled, moved, and reassembled other shelves, including many of the wall-mounted shelves, for the new layout. As part of this process, library staff worked on shifting the adult collection.
- National Library Week was observed through social media with a Facebook post highlighting library staff members and the work they have been doing during the renovation.
- The director participated in the Friends of the Library group's annual business meeting on April 20<sup>th</sup> to provide information on the library and make requests for specific purchases related to the renovation and Summer Reading program.
- A timeline was determined for reintroducing services based on the progress of repairs and the work remaining, with beginning with opening the book drop on May 3<sup>rd</sup>, offering full curbside service on May 10<sup>th</sup>, and planning to reopen the library on June 9<sup>th</sup>.


