- Conducted a Public Hearing for the Proposed Budget for the City of Sanger for Fiscal Year 2019-2020.
- Conducted the First Public Hearing on a Proposal to Increase Total Tax Revenues From Properties on the Tax Roll in the Preceding Year by 7.10% with the Proposed Tax Rate \$0.6791 per \$100 of Assessed Valuation. (Tax Rate is Proposed to Remain the Same as the Preceding Year's Tax Rate of \$0.6791 per \$100 of Assessed Valuation).

Sec. 12.802 Designation of Truck Routes

The following streets and highways within the city limits of the City of Sanger, Texas, are hereby designated as truck routes:

- (1) Interstate Highway No. 35, including service roads, between the north and south city limits of the City of Sanger.
- (2) Loop 138, constituting the business bypass route for Interstate Highway No. 35, including old United States Highway No. 77, being 5th Street in the City of Sanger.
- (3) Farm to Market Road No. 455 from the west city limits of Sanger, to the east city limits of said city.
- (4) Streets within the central business district of Sanger, and within the fire limits of the city, as provided by ordinance, including Elm, Bolivar and Cherry Streets between 1st Street and 6th Street, and 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th Streets between Elm and Cherry Streets, said district being bounded by Elm Street on the north, Cherry Street on the south, 1st Street on the east (except the closed portion of 1st Street), and 6th Street on the west.
- (5) Second Street between its intersection with Wayne Drive on the south, and Farm to Market Road No. 455 on the north.

Case Activity:

- For the month of August, 2019, the Municipal Court filed 41 citations.
- There were 4 requests for deferred disposition.
- There were 2 requests for driver safety course
- There were 5 cases successfully closed by deferred disposition and 3 cases successfully closed by driver safety course.
- The court closed 26 cases by payment in full or time served.
- The total fines, court costs and other fees collected were \$5,916.70 with \$2,070.31 of that being remitted to the State.

Driver Responsibility Program (Surcharge) Repeal

The Driver Responsibility Program has been repealed. Effective September 1, 2019, all DRP surcharge suspensions have been lifted. All surcharge assessments were waived and no future surcharges will be assessed after. You will still be responsible for any other suspensions, fines or fees on your driving record. You are no longer required to pay your surcharge installment payments. This repeal only applies to surcharges and you are still responsible for all other obligations including non-surcharge related suspensions, fines or fees.




Emergency Responses for August 2019

The Sanger Fire Department responded to 183 emergency incidents during the month of August. The top four busiest incident types:

- 101 Emergency Medical Incident
- 25 Service calls
- 8 Good Intent incidents
- 6 Fire

- The busiest times of the day tied at 11:00-11:59 and 13:00-13:59 for the month of August. Average response times was 7 minute and 34 seconds.
- The average time spent on a medical transport from initial alarm until units are back in service was 53 minutes 50 seconds.
- The busiest days of the week for EMS transports during the month August was Monday and Tuesday with 17% of the transport call volume.
- Emergency Medical calls accounted for 70.14 % of the total call volume.





The City of Sanger has established both a Type A and Type B economic development board to stimulate economic growth. These boards utilize sales tax revenues to stimulate the creation of new primary jobs in the community and to address quality of life issues. Sanger is pro-business and aggressively seeks new and expanded businesses that offer quality jobs for the community.

Staff Updates

Staff attended the Retail Live trade show in Austin, TX. Only retailers are allowed to have an exhibit at this event, so this allows brokers, landlords, developers and other related industry individuals to present projects or services to only these retailers. Participants get a chance to network directly with retailers actively expanding in Texas. Staff had the opportunity to meet face to face with many different retailers and talked about opportunities in Sanger.

Staff has made contact with several prospects expressing interest in available sites to establish a location in Sanger. Type of Industries include manufacturing, logistic center and gasoline station.

Sales taxes for the month of July were \$36,977. Sales tax totals for FY 18-19 are \$361,048 as compared to \$358,159 for the same period last FY.



Parks and Recreation

Operations:

The parks crew has continued the pesticide, fertilization, aerification, and irrigation schedule for the season. The parks crew also completed all maintenance to prepare fields for association use beginning this month. 305 acres were mowed. The Parks Department completed 83 brush orders with 60.2% of the orders being completed within 10 days on avg. 10.9 days and used an estimated 41.50 labor hours.

Facilities:

Our facilities continue to be in regular use with 23 rentals for the month of August. Facilities include our Community Center and Historical Presbyterian Church as well as park pavilions and ball fields. Our facility availability calendar along with information and forms can all be found on our website under the Parks and Recreation Department.

Recreation:

August is a quieter month as far as actual Recreational Events go but the month is heavy on planning for Fall and Winter activities. Some of the activities coming up in the Fall are the Sanger Sellabration, a second Trash Off, the annual Halloween Monster Fun Run and 5K that ends with a movie, and the Christmas Parade.

Program Highlights:

- After the conclusion of our Summer Reading program, we continued the practice of taking a break from most programs for children and teens in August. A total of 13 library-sponsored programs were held, 11 of which were for adults. A total of 182 people attended.
- The highlight of programs was the End of Summer Party on Saturday, August 3rd. A total of 63 people attended this special event, which featured a wide variety of animals - including a baby kangaroo! A short craft time followed, light refreshments were served, and the program ended with the much-anticipated drawings for the Summer Reading grand prize packs.
