ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

About your Sanger EDC

The City of Sanger has established both a Type A and Type B economic development board to stimulate economic growth. These boards utilize sales tax revenues to stimulate the creation of new primary jobs in the community and to address quality of life issues. Sanger is pro-business and aggressively seeks new and expanded businesses that offer quality jobs for the community.

Staff Updates

Staff continues to work closely with Denton County, Sanger Chamber of Commerce, and other economic development organizations to ensure every possible resource is made available to all businesses in the Sanger community affected by COVID-19.

The 4A Industrial Development Board and Staff recently contracted with a consultant to help Board Members and Staff establish and prioritize goals and objectives and summarize all information into a formal Action Plan. There are several steps involved when developing and implementing an Action Plan. Currently, the Board has been tasked with a SWOT Analysis to identify strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats the City faces today.

Staff attended a kick-off meeting for the Sanger Comprehensive Plan Update to discuss the project schedule.

Staff also attended the Sanger Area Chamber of Commerce luncheon and provided a city-wide update.

Sales tax revenue collected in May for sales in March were \$41,692. Sales tax totals for FY 19-20 are \$344,166 as compared to \$287,615 for the same period last FY.


The City of Sanger has an ordinance regulating grass, weeds and other vegetation?

Some of the requirements; Grass and weeds over 12 inches tall are prohibited. This includes the front, rear, and side yard of the property to the property lines as well as any easements or adjacent rights-of-way. Mow and trim along fences, around mailboxes, fire hydrants, etc.



New Single-Family Residential Permits FY 19-20



During the month of June 2020 Officers of the Sanger Police Department responded to a total of 727 calls for service having an average response time of five minutes per call. The department issued a total of 28 citations and 28 warnings.

Railroad Crossings: Texas Department of Transportation Driver Share the Road

In a collision with a train, you are 40 times more likely to be killed than if you were in a collision with another car.

Therefore, we urge you to remember these tips while driving near railroad crossings:

Reduce speed when approaching crossings and look both ways.

Turn down your stereo and listen for a train.

If red lights are flashing or if crossing arms have been lowered, stop.

Never stop on the tracks. A train going 50 miles per hour needs a mile and a half to stop.

Be sure all tracks are clear before crossing - there may be more than one set.

Texas law requires motorists to yield the right of way to trains. It is also against the law to cross tracks if a train is visible or to drive around gates that have been lowered at a railroad crossing. If the gates are down and no train is coming, the road is closed.



The Sanger Fire Department responded to 140 emergency incidents during the month of June. The top four busiest incident types:

- 82 Emergency Medical Incident
- 38 Service calls
- 10 Good Intent
- Five Fire
- The busiest time of the day tied at 19:00 – 19:59 for the month of June
- The busiest days of the week for EMS transports was Tuesday with 12 transports during the month.
- Emergency Medical calls accounted for 58.57 % of the total call volume.





MOBILE APPS WITH LOCAL ALERT FUNCTIONS

MUNICIPAL COURT

Case Activity:

- For the month of June 2020, the Municipal Court filed 44 citations.
- There was one request for deferred disposition.
- There were three requests for a driver safety course.
- There were two cases successfully closed by deferred disposition and two cases successfully closed by a driver safety course.
- The court closed 15 cases by payment in full or time served.
- The total fines, court costs and other fees collected were \$4,388.00 with \$1,814.00 of that being remitted to the State.








Payroll Function





Particle Sizes for Different Types of Soil

- Repair one manhole West of the Ranger Creek neighborhood.
- Make repairs to four water service lines.
- Make repairs to one water main.
- Make repairs to two sewer service lines.
- Install 16 new water meters.
- Change out eight water meters.
- Visually read 1,241 water meters that were not read by the mobile collector.
- Completed 130 water and sewer service orders.
- There were 3,178 active water connections and 2,971 active sewer connections during the month of June.

Operations:

- The Summer Reading program kicked off on June 15th, using READSquared this year for registration, logging reading and completing fun activities. The latter, also known as “missions,” were created by library staff to encourage participants to get away from their screens. Patrons can download the READSquared app to easily log their reading and missions to earn prizes.
- As part of the Summer Reading program, two take-home craft kits were created by our children’s services assistant, MaDonna Wade. The first kit, Making a Fire-Breathing Dragon, was made available on the 15th, and the second, Building a Catapult, was unveiled on June 29th.
